From Victory To Fear!

"And he was afraid and arose and ran for his life and came to Beersheba," 1 Kings 19:3

Paul in Romans 8:1 tells us, "there is now no condemnation for those in Christ Jesus." How can we who belong to Christ ever be afraid? We know that to be absent from the body is to be present with the Lord (2 Cor. 5:8). Paul concludes Romans 8 with the promise that nothing can separate us from the love of God (Rom. 8:37-39). Yet, there are times in every Christian's life when we may feel like the Prophet Elijah.


Elijah had just come off a spiritual high. He had seen God show the people of Israel that He was the one true God. One man, Elijah, against the 400 prophets of Baal. These prophets of Baal were Israelites who abandoned the worship of Yahweh. Ahab was the king of the northern kingdom of Israel. He was influenced by his wife Jezabel, a Phoenician princess, who promoted the worship of Baal. God proved to everyone that Baal was not a god at all, but a made-up god of stone and wood.

God had sent a drought upon the nation for their worship of Baal, and after Elijah's defeat of the false god's prophet, God allowed the rain to return. Yet, with all of this evidence that God was in complete control, Elijah becomes afraid of one woman, Jezebel. He even ask God to kill him, "But he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a broom tree; and he asked for himself that he might die, and said, "It is enough; now, O Yahweh, take my life, for I am not better than my fathers." (1 Kings 19:4) He feels alone, overwhelmed, and discouraged.

There is a lesson here for all of us. How do you go from calling down fire to crying under a tree? The truth is, emotional crashes often follow spiritual highs. Elijah wasn't weak in faith; he was worn out, afraid, and alone. How did God respond? With compassion:He sent an angel to give Elijah food and rest. He spoke, not through wind, earthquake, or fire — but in a gentle whisper.

He reminded Elijah that he wasn't alone. And He gave him a new assignment — proof that Elijah's story wasn't over. You might be there now — tired, afraid, feeling alone, even after a spiritual breakthrough. Remember this: God sees your weariness. He doesn't push you away for feeling afraid. He meets you with grace, not judgment, and He still has a purpose for you. You are not forgotten, and you are not finished.

his sin-atoning Priest.

- 6. The Spirit teaches us to roll all our burdens on the Lord, and to live outside of ourselves by daily desiring vital supplies from Christ.
- 7. The Spirit teaches us the beauty of holiness.
- 8. The Spirit teaches us the reality and sweetness of communion with God. While many are contented to worship in the outward court the Christian desires to penetrate into the holy of holies, where he can hear the words, and see the resplendent face of Immanuel.
