Friends!

"Now it happened when he had finished speaking to Saul, that the soul of Jonathan was knit to the soul of David, and Jonathan loved him as his own soul."

1 Samuel 18:11

The story of David and Johnathan's friendship is one of those stories in scripture that can be quickly overlooked. They could not have been more different than one another. David was a shepherd; Jonathan was a prince. Jonathan had his own armor; David had a harp and a slingshot. Jonathan grew up in the palace and was trained in the art of war; David grew up in a village and was trained to tend sheep. Jonathan was the oldest son and in line to inherit the throne; David was the youngest of eight boys and anointed the next king in place of Jonathan. Jonathan was from the tribe of Benjamin, David was from the tribe of Judah. Despite their differences, they became dear friends.

Many assume that David and Johnathan were around the same age, but the fact is that David was 30 years younger than Jonathan. Near the beginning of Saul's reign, his son, Jonathan was already fighting. Israelite men did not become soldiers until they were at least twenty years old (Numbers 1:3). Saul reigned 40 years (Acts 13:21). He and Jonathan died in the same battle (1 Sam. 31:2-6). Thus, Jonathan was at least sixty when he died, while David was only thirty (2 Sam. 5:4). Despite this age difference, they had an endearing friendship. So attached was David to his loyal friend that, after Jonathan's death, David wrote a song to him, a tribute filled with heart-wrenching pathos (2 Samuel 1:19–27). Theirs was a friendship closer than brotherhood.

One of the great blessings that God gives us in this life is a close friendship with another believer. The Bible describes a true friend in the following ways: They forgive and do not hold grudges (Proverbs 17:9). They are loyal (Proverbs 18:24). They influence godly behavior (Proverbs 27:17). They correct in love (Proverbs 27:5-6). They show love no matter the circumstance (Proverbs 17:17). A true friend gives heartfelt advice, bringing joy to the heart (Proverbs 27:9). A true friend helps in time of need (Ecclesiastes 4:9-12).


